Notes about the Bachelor of Arts (BA) Degree, Major: Criminology

- MATH 1116 at Columbus State requires completion of MATH 1075 or MATH 1099 (1075). Students may need to complete additional preparatory math courses to satisfy the prerequisites for MATH 1116 instead of the MATH 1109 required for the AAS CRJ degree. Students should consult with their faculty advisor in CRJ about a requirement substitution for the MATH 1109.
- Students complete the AAS CRJ- Probation & Supervision Track degree, plus the additional Ohio Transfer Module certificate at Columbus State. Students then will complete three semester or 44 semester hours of Criminology Major and Sociology Minor course work to meet remaining requirements for their degree at Capital. Students must complete the Ohio Transfer Module to waive Capital general education requirements. If a student does not complete the OTM certificate, they should connect with Capital advisors about any remaining general education course work needing completion at Capital.
- Capital requires 124 credit hours to graduate and 2.0 cumulative GPA to receive the degree. Thirty of the last 36 hours must be completed at Capital.
- This program can be completed either in Capital’s traditional day undergraduate program or in the evening adult degree completion program. However one semester of a foreign language is required for traditional daytime students; adult degree completion students are waived from the foreign language requirement.
